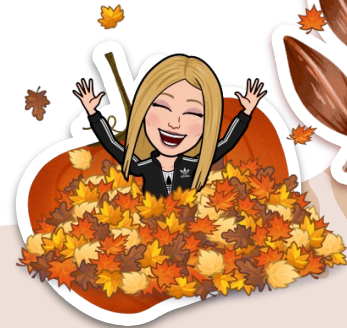


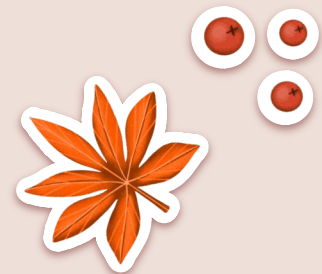

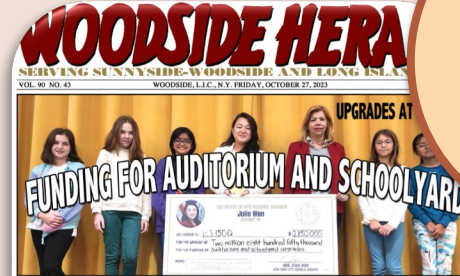

On Friday, October 20, New York City Council Member Julie Wira was joined by P.S. 150 Principal Carmen Pascale, school staff, members of the PTA, and students to celebrate \$2,850,000 in funding for much-needed upgrades to the school's auditorium and schoolyard. Following a video message from P.S. 150 community, the Council Member received a total of \$2 million in funding to upgrade the outdated auditorium. The Council Member also allocated \$500,000 from her capital funding for schoolyard upgrades.



On Friday, October 15, Council Member Wira was joined by Varsity Boys and Girls Club of Woodside, Principal Loretta Pomeroy, and staff and students from P.S. 150 to announce \$300,000 in funding to create after-school programs for 6th, 7th, and 8th graders. 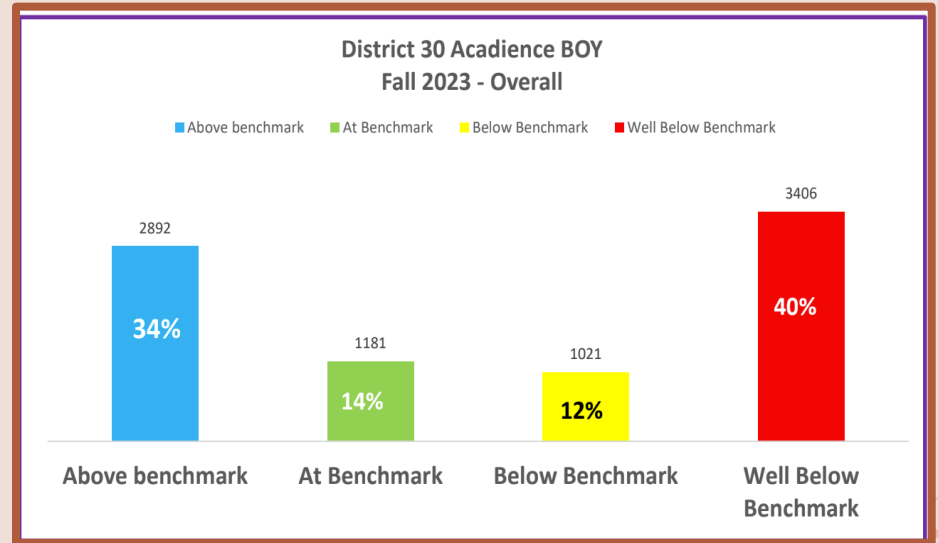
District 30 BOY Data



D30 Acadience Beginning of year data



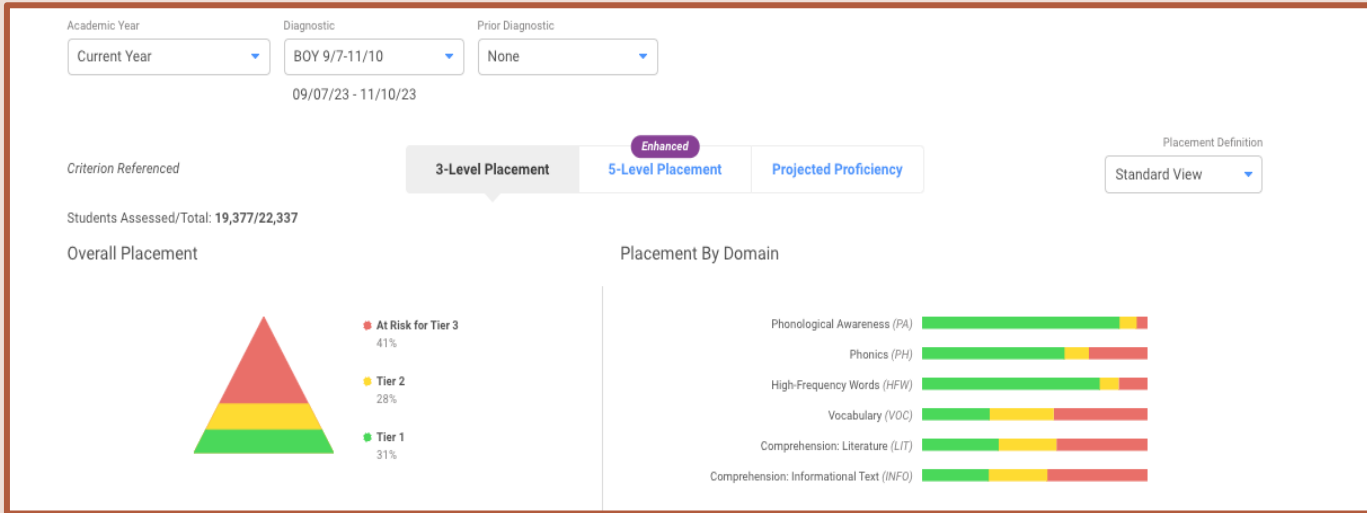
