





SCA Citywide Highlights



\$8.44 billion for over 60,000 new seats in fulfillment of the Mayor's commitment to reduce overcrowding as well as advance equity



\$1.41 billion in support of Early Learn, 3-K and Pre-K for All Initiatives



\$750 million to make 50% of elementary school buildings partially or fully accessible and 1/3 of all buildings fully accessible



\$261 million for electrical work to support air conditioning in all classrooms by the end of 2021



\$1.01 billion for technology enhancements



\$352 million to allow for TCU removals

Capital Investment Projects

The SCA performs major capital improvement work in existing buildings, in addition to building new schools.

This work includes projects such as: masonry repair, window and roof replacement, new boilers, HVAC systems, new fire alarm systems, public address systems, electrical upgrades, repairing major plumbing issues, removal of TCUs and playground rehabilitation.

DOE's Division for School Facilities (DSF), which include school custodial engineers, plant managers, facility directors, and DSF central staff, is responsible for day-today maintenance and repair of school buildings.

Our agencies are separate but work closely together to maintain NYC schools.



How does something become a capital project in the SCA's Five Year Capital Plan?

In addition to suggestions from Community Education Councils, there are several routes, including:

Building Condition Assessment Survey (BCAS): SCA assesses every school in the city in a yearly Building Condition Assessment Survey (BCAS). BCAS reports for every school building are available on the DOE's website on each school's individual page.

Problem Reported to the DOE Division for School Facilities and Emergency Issues: If DSF determines a needed repair is very large/complex/costly it may be referred to SCA for an assessment. In emergencies, SCA may also do immediate make-safe repairs.


Funding from Elected Officials: The local New York City Council Member, Borough President, or state elected officials may also fund projects.

City-wide Initiatives: Mayoral & City Council initiatives, such as Physical Education for All and the Air Conditioning program.




P.S. 151 | TCU Removal & Playground Redevelopment



District 30 MWLBE Participation & Mentor Program

In FY21 Citywide, SCA awarded \$558,863,141 in prime MWLBE contracts across 409 projects to 128 firms

In this District, SCA has \$32,039,175 in active MWLBE contracts across 37 projects to 25 firms this fiscal year.

In FY21 the SCA Mentor Program awarded \$81,854,002 in MWLBE contracts across 249 projects to 93 firms




CEC Requests


CEC's have a voice in requesting capital projects as well. Each year CECs are asked to fill out a form indicating priority projects in schools in your districts. We ask that you prioritize your top 5, as those will be reviewed first.

Remember that the SCA does major capital renovations only. Please carefully consider whether the projects you are prioritizing are capital eligible. For everyday repairs in schools, principals should request repairs from custodians/DSF.

Capital projects must provide a permanent enhancement with a lifespan of at least 5 years, and a minimum cost of \$50K.

The Community Education Council (CEC) Request Form is a tool designed for CECs to submit requests to improve and maintain existing and new school structures within the New York City Department Of Education school system. Please submit all requests by Friday, January 14th, 2022. Requests will not be accepted directly from individual schools. Any request from schools will be forwarded to the appropriate CEC for review and prioritization.
