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They were 10 by 15 for our graduations and they're placed throughout the district we have met ps 7692 122 145 151 51 171 and two to seven, and we've asked a lot principles to know that they belong to all of us so that if anybody wants to borrow it now

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later, they can we can borrow them and move them around but thank you cc because that was wonderful.

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And everybody who received them what happened and looking forward to graduation.

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Do you want to let you know that is to 30 is now a vaccination site it'll only be one day.

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June 14 from six in the morning to 6pm. That means all young people can get the vaccination anybody can walk in parents as well.

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Feel free any staff members can go to be a one day June 14 from 6am to 6pm at is to third.

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I'm happy to say that we've been working with our pre k centered from Central, and we have been able to open up special classes and integrated settings, both in our pre k center.

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And then, in our ph 76 we opened up several classes yeah I'm happy to.

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It's really good to be able to do that because we have the children, we're going to make sure we take care of them.

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Rising New York Road Runners district 30 pre k centers are in the top 5% of rising New York road running programs across the country. So when I asked the director, what does that mean, it says they actually both the kids receive sneakers.

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T shirt and pen, because they kept track of all the movement that they did during the day, and they were in the top 5% of the country and movement for little guy so I'm really proud of them to

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New York project covert ps 92 Project Hope is a new program that will be available to students and staff in school communities that continue to adjust to the challenging of the covert 19 public health emergency.

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So that's located at ps 92 saliva tests we do have one school that they're experimenting with a saliva test and that's at ps 84, where they have the saliva test pilot, that is being conducted by rover labs Robo Labs is a coven 19 Testing Service that

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performs PCR tests on self collected saliva samples so that's just started at PSAT for just one school in the district.

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So, we have on June 22 is our primary day right everybody knows that for Democrats and Republicans, and we have several of our schools that are involved in that.

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So what does that mean you might be getting a letter from them that there'll be some remote learning.

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We, we took the creativity of putting children in our cafeterias is classrooms in our gyms in our auditoriums, and that's usually where they have their voting, so of course we don't want to, you know, disrupt voting but we certainly want our children's

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education to go forward. So those schools have notified their parents and they will be going remote for June 22.

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Beginning June 1, the IEP page on the students account now displays additional details about a students related services and programs, services. This includes displaying the name of the students related service provider, as well as the first and last

I handed you out last month, a list of schools that will be summer school rising summarizing program, just said it has we've updated a little bit move some around so let's look at the list if you'd like

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anybody else will be posted on our website.

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So, for to update you on our graduation and moving up ceremonies schools may host out to a drive in and drive through a virtual graduation in end of year ceremonies.

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Schools are strongly encouraged to hold in person graduations outdoor settings. in case where schools do not have the option to host an outdoor graduation.

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They may request approval from the superintendent to hold into a graduations, so we have been really lucky I said with all those wonderful tents and we have about 10 to 12 big yachts throughout the district, and the principles are all sharing them and

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they're sharing these tense. So most of all graduations if not all will be outside.

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So that's pretty exciting as well.

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They changed the three K and pre k curriculum.

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The deal he provided circular resources for three K and pre k classrooms, including exploration interdisciplinary instructional guidance for three K and interdisciplinary unit of study for pre K.

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So beginning in the 2223 school year. These programs will be in place, and will be very rigorous for our young people and full of fun.

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So this is guidance for our high school Summer Program.

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Summarizing high school offers all high school students a chance to make up previously failed courses, complete course in progress, participate in accelerated academics, as well as engaged and improve career readiness opportunities and enrichment courses.

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So we encourage all of our high school students to please you know if you need some credits. This is your opportunity to make sure you get your diploma.

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We were asking for support on our New York City School survey I'm sorry parents out there I'm a little disappointed our numbers are really low with our parents they've extended it now to June 11 spread the word.

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It's your opportunity to to you know weigh in and on your school on your administration your teachers and all the wonderful things that are happening.

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So, we've been lucky to have several law schools, turn in some highlights I'm just going to read one from each one of the schools, because I'm not gonna take your time but I'm proud of all of our schools and these are just schools that wanted their name

You have the courage to be yourselves, and to say I don't know and I like that I like that that it doesn't just, you don't rubber stamp things you

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really think about it and you work on and you make sure it happens for children.

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Advocates definitely you're all advocates as far as I'm concerned, I think it's heavy thinking we do at night, you know sometimes we hear it. After 10 and we're still thinking thinking it's good community minded.

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That's such an important piece that we represent right I think back all the children I represent and families as you do we represent them and sometimes we can't put our own feelings, but we have to know what's good for the whole, that's the hardest part

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sometimes on daunting. We know that that it is important to be strong persevere, never give up. breath of fresh air, intelligent kind peacemakers peacemakers that's the most important word of the day, And I didn't get you all a little book.

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So I'm going to mail it to those and if not I hope to see some brown but I'm going to get to this it's called the lessons of a turtle, and this book is really a great book and so a little sayings and it's about lessons have a turtle is wise and one little

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book about slowing down and finding your own path in life.

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It's a celebration of simplicity, a reminder that the little things in life really are the big things in life and that's what I really care about all of you, you know what's important, you know, and our children are always at the center of that and that's

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what's important. So with that, I thank all of you, and I promise to get you this book one way or the other. I don't know how the we'll figure it out.

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Thank you.

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Thanks.

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Thanks, impasto, and I just want to thank the whole board. I'm not coming back. My kids are all big and grown now, my granddaughter's already in third grade.

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But I came into CC, believing that we have great local public school, and I'm leaving knowing that the true.

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My experience in each of our public schools has taught me that I need to stop, look at the numbers, and the score, they don't matter.

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What we really need our school, our kids love to attend because they love learning.

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And many of our schools that love we felt the mini you enter the schoolhouse door.

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The key is to build an environment where everyone feels welcome, and to create a culture where everyone is traveling to the same goal to foster a love of learning.

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And the key success of any schools incorporates, not just the students and their family, but the entire community to build a strong school, and an even stronger community.

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And my time on the CCI work empower parents and integrate them and the fabric of each of our school, and it's not easy.

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And parents parents be true stakeholders, takes a lot of time and commitment, and it's something we must continue to strive for.

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We have to create welcome environments for parents feel like they're an integral part of the school.

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We try to sneak peek in the beginning. I'm hoping the CC will continue to push to bring parents and every step, and you see a sneak peek. We are doing Sneak Peek we're preparing.

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We're ready for it. Are you kidding. But I really just think that that those basic ideas I came in with are the same ones that I'm leaving with that, we need to make sure that parents can communicate with other parents, whether it be the class list or

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parent or school directory. Having a school Handbook, whether it be in paper or virtual these the keys to let parents have an entryway in the school, make sure that our full become a family, and one that become the community center, and we need to invite

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invite parents and not for one day or two days, or for parent orientation or teacher, meeting the teachers, it should be a place they go into every day and they feel they're part of a true Community Center.

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And I think that we've learned from this pandemic. How much we missed our school, you know they say, absence makes the heart grow fonder, and we saw that with this endemic, how many of us had kids who were just dying to go back to school they miss school

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so much.

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And that you'll need to return to school shows how much are kids not love not just learning, but also the school itself as a family.

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Each of our schools is unique. But we must strive to build a school that the center of each community and really reflect, not wanting to kids, their parents but the entire community.

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I know we have great local public schools and working with all of you has really shown me how much we can really impact to make them better. And we do that by making them something that our community is proud.

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And I think working here it's been a real pleasure and a joy and I thank you for allowing me.

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Excellent.

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Good afternoon, everybody.

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Hey, maybe it's killing be my last time with you.

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And just saying few words, thank you for all of you for the support to me was giving to each other, even with this epidemic we couldn't see each other for more than 14 months, but we try to solve all the issues we have in our schools.

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And we never get like against each other. this is the best thing about our team.

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Even if I'm not going to be with the team, I will keep fighting for my community and for our schools, if I have any issue and parent complain.

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I will mention it to the new cc people.

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And I know Dr composter wanted to be the first one who's going to help with solving any issue or any problem about our district 30 schools, thank you for all the support guys giving me and giving each other.

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And they hope to see you before the end of this month if we're not able to see each other.

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Thank you for everything.

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Anybody else you can think about it. I just want to point out preteen showed up preteen we were saying singing your praises how wonderful you are, and how smart and how proud of you and thankful that you've been on our council, So I just didn't I you

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like sort of snuck in the room and I wasn't looking anyway. So we wanted to thank you prefer, for being a part of this council and being so wonderful and caring.

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Thank you.

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As you move forward. Thank you. I'm sorry I had a doctor's appointment so I'm a little late, but I really really enjoyed my time here and I'm, I'm really sad, actually.

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Well, we thank you and you can come visit anytime.

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Thank you, that you have your hand up.

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Yeah, hi how are you, everyone. I'm so sorry I had really bad connection and it's like kicked me from the meeting. I just want to thank you so much to all the CC member for vector compatible from you that Rob.

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Rob and all the team.

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It was my pleasure to be part of the CC for the last two years. And I'm very proud of all of the work that was done from all of the colleagues and also from Dr C, and very happy and I will continue working even like with them.

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If I'm no longer like with them. cc team. It's my pleasure again to be supportive and be part of the district 30. Thank you.

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Thank you for two months.

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That Can I say something real quick.

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Now that I'm a stop crying.

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I have learned a lot

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and I enjoyed serving and accounts.

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I'm sorry.

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As well, you know, my time is up.

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My Lady Bug got two more years ago and she graduated from high school. How time flies.

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I have learned a lot from all the accounts, the same way as you learn for me.

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I thank you for all your prayers and blessings.

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When I was sick.

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And I didn't know I was going to make it back with me and God brought me through and I thank you for that. I consider your all as my family, or a lot for each and every one of you for this council, great experience for me.

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I'm going to continue.

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So fight for our children and our parents, And I'm going to be the voice of reason.

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But what I wanted to say was thank you for the kind words, and the support that job. Show me.

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And these are on this counts.

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And you're all would be truly missed. And I want you to know.

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So always be kind to one another because it is too short, and hope that the new council that come in, will treat everybody with respect, kindness, peaceful, and be humble to everyone.

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And just learn to listen and always come together as one.

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Guys, don't be truly Miss, but I'm always going to be here, and I'm always email.

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Kisses. You to Katrina Take care of yourself.

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I show well. Thank you.

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Goodbye. We love you. We'll see you at the next meeting this country that my phone numbers updated for anybody you know over my email you know I'm not hard to find.

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By all means anytime you guys you know, to give the same group, the CC group and you wanted to create a new group for you. you see, is the only things we can keep in touch maybe yes we need to we need to keep in touch.

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Maybe when things get better.

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Maybe we go off and on an email and maybe we could meet in the park. During the summer have a cup of coffee and just catch up to see how in game Yes, everybody, I mean everybody, Scott.

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Cook.

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Danny will be here with us anymore but she can be on this call.

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Jonathan, all of us. I mean, you should all come together and just have a cup of coffee and just talk and catch up and see how everyone is doing a whole lot so I'm a whole that too.

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Anybody else.

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We can also talk some more in our business meeting.

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If not, we can go to public speaking.

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All right.

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So, if you want to get council members, an opportunity to speak before the public.

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Oh, that's what I just did. Oh, sorry, I meant on, not on this time anytime.

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Yeah, the floor is yours.

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I don't actually have an exam just wanted to make sure we have space to speak.

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Yeah, I guess members or members have any comments, you know, based upon the Council on why especially on doctrinal problems report here, the floor is yours.

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I guess if somebody wanted to chat,

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a Google Plus Stoneleigh has a comment of where to go.

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Okay. So we asked all of the SLT to talk some of them have and some holding on. there's a lot of discussion going on.

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The first piece is I just said everybody know newly had asked for latest start time for the 34th Avenue piece, but there are parents who have some

concerns because they use that as a drop off their staff that have concerns that sometimes it's easy to

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get parking in the morning. So the last I heard some school, everybody's talking about it I haven't heard no yes or knows is still discussing it so it is a topic of discussion but those are some of the pieces that was sort of the sticking point that people

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were concerned about new lead.

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Is there any has there any been any discussion with dot about extending the hours earlier, so that the schools could keep their eight o'clock start time but yet, have an open street for the half hour perhaps for the half hour before school starts.

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I'm meeting with them again we've asked repeatedly but I'm meeting with them again tomorrow, bring it up again.

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The 830 start, it's the perfect time the issue is between eight and 810 is like the most dangerous time on the street. That's when we're stopping the traffic and the pedestrian thing going on and I'm just worried that kids might come on before traffic

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stops, but it does offer a corridor for all the kids to add all those schools to kind of travel safely back and forth, especially for our middle school kids, because those are the kids usually blocked by themselves.

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So I'd really love to see that they'd be able to utilize that as a state order. If you ever been on 34th Avenue around central time it just fills the kids, and it's a nice safe way for them to get home.

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So, I just want to make encourage them to use that as a safe way to get to school, and to do that you really need to start talking about a 30.

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I also

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like the idea of closing the street at 730, because parents feel very comfortable that you know we house, our children in the morning for them we help them go to work, they have to go to work too.

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So that would be, I would go, you know, write a letter if you want to speak to do it that's would be the best thing for all i have i agree what

you're saying, but I also hear the parents in the staff with their concerns.

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At night, you can forward it to them to remediate against my morning at 930 so i'd love your support, including the earlier.

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Okay, you got it.

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I also have some questions just about the vaccine offered is security death for the public or just the school community.

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All right, let me go right back to my notes here make sure that I read it exactly as I said it.

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I thought it was open for the whole community honest isn't the title.

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It says here that this time frame is in effect to catch students and their families at entry and dismissal as well as staff during the school day, so that you know the the children and their families.

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And then I've asked the question about summarizing.

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So, from what I figured out from all this is basically pools going to open, and multiple schools are going to go to different school some schools will have it for themselves that temple have multiple schools in them.

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And it'll be academic in the morning the school will do the academic part and then CVO will come into the afternoon. It's each school bringing their own studio, and who's in charge of chopping up all these spaces and dealing with the whole bureaucracy

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of all that.

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So, so thank you. Those are great questions and we're still working some out but I'm happy to say. As of today, we make we have it CVO in every school that was off first.

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At one. And how did that work by the way they just said you would know I was wondering myself and they were UYCD, and they're the ones who, you know, assign them of course their community based organizations in the community, but some are not directly

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in our community, but all of our schools have it in one site finalize it I'll send you the list of what CEOs are at what school so all of our schools have that piece right now.

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And the other interesting piece was the CEOs registered children differently in other words they were registering children, and now we're registering children.

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So there's something we have to now figure out and what I understand is some parents did fights with Rob.

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So some some parents, you know registered several sites so there's a lot of little pieces that we're still trying to iron out right now.

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Did I answer all the questions any others that I missed. More I'm more. Okay, so, some kids are mandated in Sunday school are the mandatory kids and the kids who elected go to some arising, are going to be identical for both kids or they're going to be

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a different track, it's a different program we're hoping to, you know, we're going to do academics as you said, but one will be an enrichment, and and the other one will be more remediation to help them make sure that they passed from get promoted.

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So how would that look so for the mandated kid. What are they going to do and for the regular summarizing kids.

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What would the day look like I guess so. The day is going to be eight to 12 with the kids are doing academics, you might be doing enrichment and I'm going to be working on my standards, you know to catch skill building.

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So, we're not we're still figuring out the curriculum piece right so like one of the things that I'm happy to say that on last Wednesday I was able to contract out with brain pop.

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And they going to do the entire district for free. So we will have la math, science and social studies, digital in our schools as well that'll be really good for our STEM piece.

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And then we have, where each one of our principles were asked to use their curriculum and this is where it gets a little different because

each one of our schools sometimes use different curriculum and the interesting part is this year, as we are now

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looking at our children, for the first time we have many children that are out of our district. Some of them are even out of the borrow, because it was open to all children.

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So we are just trying to figure all of this out. One of the things that we did was we asked our teachers to create some of portfolios that if any of our young people from 30 end up in Brooklyn or the Bronx, we can then at least show the school where they

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are and where they should be going. So that's what we're hoping to figure it all out once we get going. But to be honest, we're not there yet we're still like registering we're not even sure about numbers.

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So just hypothetically if I have a fourth grader who attend ps 92, that is going to be at 149, but it's going to be with other kids from ps 92 at 149 and fall PFC curriculum.

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Everybody know because his children from all over the city.

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So, they're not going to say 92 for 149 children out of it, we're going to mix them all up we're going to try to assess the where they are and then group them that way according to their needs.

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So, is there going to be like I said the UFC teachers are teaching.

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And the UFC rules and apply how many kids in the classroom because normally summer school is a very specific thing. It's kind of very focused on few students and very intensive.

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So, I assume that the same for the mandated that correct said again. Yes, for the mandate a kid is going to be this way chemicals always been going to be very focused, academic, trying to get there.

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Yes, that's to be a separate room than these enrichment kid. Correct. Let me nice mix of kids from all over the place.

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And what is that going to look like. Today, give me like a kind of a sample day over enrichment you want to show the academics are working but they can have a trip to so enrichment will go on trips will be doing some STEM activities with them, there'll



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be art pieces for them as well. Depending on the school, and what they have in teachers like who they received as a teacher so you might have an art teacher might have a computer teacher, I have a dance teacher.

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So that's what we're still trying to hire I believe in that was acquiring the teachers. We have not completed that task yet either. You know, so all those pieces once we we get that will then be able to define more quickly what enrichment is and what

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the UFC rules apply but how many kids can be in a classroom with the pandemic number, thank you for saying that because we received an email.

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On Friday from the Chancellor stating that this summer.

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There will be a three foot rule in place, so we know we're not going to put full classrooms in there right because we have the three foot rule in place, you're probably only going to get 10 or 12 kids in the classroom.

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So that's that's a good thing. It'll be a small class size so that's what we know right now for sure there will be a three foot rule, and then we're trying to we're working on this too right because you heard today that the state said when young people

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people go outside, they can take off the mask.

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At this point the city still says mask on and I want to say that to all of our parents I know we've added graduation these compensation have come up in with parents and saying well we're outside we want to take on that school of, we're going to ask everybody

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to politely keep it on because that's what they're asking us to do at this point, you know, things change every day you know that right so at this point, we have been told as of today, if where the children are still outside they are to keep them as gone.

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And we, we have been told, be prepared to do the three foot rule in September as well. So we're just. These are the things that we know right now and we're trying to work with that piece so classroom size will be good for us I think it'll be good.

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Now what about mixing the kids, a lot of these kids have been home remote a long time, and they're all nervous about getting back into the

classroom. So when they go in the morning and they do this academic class will be the same class the entire summer

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and in the afternoon when they do this CVO section will be all different kids again. And how do we manage from them going from zero interaction with kids to all this interaction with kids.

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So, so we implant intend to plan every day we do a fun activity in the morning, we've been doing that since the pandemic started with kids just talk about their feelings, you know, what happened last night What did you do what did you know what game did

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you play what computer what they just it's like, just to get to know you, we do that each and every day there's different activities that we have set up with the kids do with the teachers just to feel comfortable, and we know what kind of frame of mind

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they're in what happened to them, and where it's going. So we'll do that again in the summer, we will do that again in the summer, for all children not only just our academic or our enrichment children but it will children we do that it's been working

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out for us. I mean, some of the schools are really wonderful they had the parents come in in the morning it's really interesting to see how the world has changed a little differently for us now.

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It's sort of we think differently and it's a good, it's a good thought, you know that we're now including families get writing these lessons you know they write them in the rooms everybody being a part of the learning.

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That's what we intend to do to make our children feel comfortable, and we'll do that again in September, for those children that are not coming for Sunday school, but did not come all year long because it is hard transition you're absolutely right.

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But as far as them being in different programs in the afternoon, I thought the way this work with those children are there in the morning, will stay in the afternoon to, and they're not we're not breaking them up.

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Moms and dads or caretakers have a right to say, I want to bring my child home, you know I don't want him to stay where I don't want her to stay. But on the whole, the children are planning, they were planning on children to stay full days.

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That's our plan.

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I guess my question is, basically, is there any effort being made to keep that same cohort of students together

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in the classroom into the afternoon part or is it a mixed up again. No, our intentions try to keep them together.

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Now, nothing always is perfect because I see that in some schools we have two studios in there, you know, so we have to see you know but yes that's our intent to do right by the kids and keep them together.

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Well, and I think only 149 I think it's like three or four and 149.

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They're bringing kids from different schools that all associate with different CVO Correct, correct. Each school comes with a senior but that's not necessarily true sometimes some of them we have less, I promise to get you all the names.

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And like I said, we're just finalizing our everything is up in the air, because one of the things that has happened was that the CEOs contracted out say for 50 kids, or 100 kids, and we might have 150.

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So we are now like renegotiating with central that you know we've got to get the CEO, another 50 kids or another 30 kids so we can watch children go so overboard was still in the app we will be ready for opening day, but all your questions are good, that

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we're asking as well, but some of them are still in play.

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And when's the last day for family to register for summarizing for the academic piece.

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What one piece, isn't it, no red shirts white well they registered with the state you could have registered with the CEO or now you can register with it with the different pieces.

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So I mean, the promise is that all killed him will be taken so somebody missed it by a deadline of a day or two, you know, we can you know we can take them but we have room we're going to take them.

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And is there a deadline I haven't seen a deadline, I don't know I haven't either but I'm not gonna say yes or no, but I do know that every summer.

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Sometimes children come a week late, you know what, something happens or they might have been in a parochial school and they show up, we take them. And we don't turn them away so as long as we have room, we take all the children, no matter when they come

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but yes, we appreciate the best part is that they've already registered so that we know exactly how many teachers we need, and we can have a robust program, and we're not putting children together in large numbers.

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And the question for every single program, one of your family has a vacation plans for one of the weeks and they still attend that they're going to be away for one week.

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Listen, we know that we will work with a parent will give them work to do and you know depending on a enrichment child Are they an academic child in need of making sure that they pass for the.

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So those are the youngsters that we want to work the most with who ensure that they could get promoted the idea of summer school is right now, all those youngsters have an opportunity to do this work and be promoted.

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And that's our goal by the end of the summer to promote our children who go there on what we call a mandated child, so that we make sure they get promoted, that's where we put all our energy to make sure of.

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So, if they have to go on vacation I get it, we will get it will just talk to mom, dad, grandma, to say, listen, try them do this and this.

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And we'll make it work.

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Now, we have the number of them how many mandated kids so any.

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Not yet. We don't have working on all of this, because you know we don't. In the past, they use the state examination to figure that out. So in other words that city would say to us all those tools in ones, those are you mandated children, so it was it

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Those are your mandated children, so it was it was a no brainer. The come right out of the computer city would tell you what, which children so now

we are now working with families and children, and we're taking into consideration this whole pandemic

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piece, you know, that was hindering our children's learning. So it's, it's a multiple pieces here that we're trying to put together, before we make any decisions.

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I guess what is the general tenor it has no idea, to kind of not mandated many kids maybe encourage them to summarize instead, or a crazy year to make as many kids as possible so they get as much as possible, and what the general what's your philosophy

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on it. So my philosophy is, it's all about all children summarizing is supposed to be a seamless piece that's the goal is seamless. They go from the education into the camp He's my philosophy is what I said to the principal invite every child in that

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My philosophy is what I said to the principal invite every child in that school that wanted to come, you know, those that we that are super mandated to have a private conversation like this is the right thing for your child gets promoted, but even for

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those children who are on the wire bring them in, I think all the kids should come in I mean, like you said they've been in these houses, this would be a great opportunity for them to come to to do some learning, and hopefully have some fun in this camp,

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you know trips and everything I am recommending the more the better for our children.

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Just a quick thing on summarizing, I thought I read somewhere or heard that they're going to be requiring the traditional vaccinations.

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You know this year, a lot of folks didn't get their kids to their annual physicals. Can you just talk a little bit about that and how they're going to let parents know what they need to do.

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Thank you. yeah I got that memo today but you're absolutely right. What happened this year was very interesting, usually by September something. Parents have told you have to have this vaccination, or your kid cannot come to school, and we literally then

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have, you know, give them a grace period we talked to them we send them letters we do it back and forth. Then after a certain period of time, they're excluded from the school.

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So, this year what the board did so and I'm these all hypothetical dates and I would say like it was September 15, they said okay, maybe October 15, and then October, well November because what happens with a lot of the children were remote.

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So, we didn't want to exclude them from from remote learning. So they push to date and as Deborah pointed out now, we are now going into summer school, and we're not sure how many of those children who have read, who registered, who do not have the immunization,

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and if they do not have all the immunization, they will be getting a letter from Central, stating that they cannot come to summer school.

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Well, on that note, the department health has the open the free vaccination site is now in Brooklyn, New all the train and no appointment sorry, any cake and just show up and say I need vaccines and they give it to them send it will happen at 230, and

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I believe face gave us a nice website that you can go on and see you know not not the coven backing I'm talking about their missing of that oh okay for a long time that center was close.

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It is reopened again it's in Brooklyn, but it was closed for a month, because my kid was missing a vaccine, which ones have now reopened and you can get all your vaccines again.

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Oh, perfect.

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So we're not sure exactly who that is, but they will be answering your question they will be getting a letter informing them that they have to have this vaccination to come to summarizing.

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Hi, can you hear me. Yes we can.

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even though I think it's the best thing for them, and they may be other panelists like that also. So, I know we're waiting for stuff to be organized and stuff but the sooner they can get anything up on the website, because we perish we go and we check

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the face and see what the CEOs are and what they offer, but doesn't really give us any insight as to what's going on. And if you know as soon as they can make it more transparent, it would be a big help.

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I think would be a big help. Also I wanted to also thank all of you for your time and effort on working on this TC, and the engagements that you've had with community is been encouraging.

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I look forward to seeing some of you again in the future, and best of luck over this long, everybody.
