Admissions Waitlist Offers for Students in MySchools

3K, **Pre-K**, **and Kindergarten**: Schools will begin to make waitlist offers, through the School Portal to students who may have been added to the waitlist, provided there are available seats. Note that waitlist offers must be made in order of waitlist position.

Middle Schools: Schools will begin to make offers, through the School Portal provided there are available seats. Offers will be made to zoned students (students new to NYC and zoned to the school), or continuing students (students who initially received an offer to another school but are now interested in changing their offer to the zoned school) who have been waitlisted to the middle school. Note that waitlist offers must be made in order of waitlist position.

High Schools: Schools will begin to make offers, through the School Portal, to high school students who have been waitlisted to the school, providing there are available seats. Note that waitlist offers must be made in order of waitlist position.
