Participate in the 2024 Student Voter Registration Drive During Civics Week

- The DOE invites school officials to participate in Civics Week activities, including the 2024 Student Voter Registration Drive, from **March 11–15**.

2024 Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP) Lottery and 2023 SYEP Data

All students ages 14–24 are invited to apply to participate in the 2024 Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP), which is now accepting applications for summer 2024 via the general lottery through **March 1**. Please share the program flyer with your school community and encourage your students to apply. For questions, email SYEP@schools.nyc.gov.

Additional Guidance for Students with IEPs for the SYEP Application: As in previous years, you and your staff are encouraged to support students with Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) and 504 Plans with the application process. Interested students should follow this TCAC Online Application Guide and submit an online application for their age group through their borough's Transition and College Access Center (TCAC) office by 5:00 p.m. on **March 1**. TCACs will support students with IEPs and 504 Plans with the necessary information to be added to their applications in order to receive targeted support for placement in the TCAC-specific lottery; this enhances their chances of being placed in their respective borough and program choice.

Distribute IDNYC Applications to High School Students

- In accordance with Local Law 48, schools are required to distribute information on IDNYC applications to high school students by **March 1**. Launched in 2015, IDNYC is a card for all New Yorkers, regardless of immigration status. The free, municipal identification card provides access to a wide variety of services and programs offered by the City. For cardholders age 16 and older, cards are valid for five years from the date the application was approved. For cardholders under the age of 16, cards are valid for two years from the date the application was approved.
- To acquire an ID, high school students can make an appointment through the IDNYC online portal or can visit a site accepting walk-in applicants. For additional information on IDNYC including a FAQ, review the IDNYC online portal.
- As a reminder, the DOE does not ask about or track student immigration status, and any and all resources must be made available to all students and families.

Respect For All Week

- This year's Respect for All (RFA) Week will take place from **February 12–16**. During RFA Week, school officials should celebrate, highlight, and build upon ongoing diversity programs and curriculum-based instruction. They should develop new initiatives that promote respect for diversity and engage students in meaningful lessons and/or other activities that focus on preventing bias-based harassment, intimidation, and/or bullying.
- Topics include, but are not limited to, celebrating kindness; being an ally; combatting and reporting bullying and cyber-bullying; respect for diversity, disability, and religious acceptance; respecting gender identity and gender expression; and LGBTQ pride and acceptance. Additionally, school officials are asked to share with families and guardians the RFA week video with translated captions and the Respect For All flyer (available in all DOE languages) with resources for students and parents.

Prepare to Administer the 2024 NYC School Survey

- All 3–K/pre–K and K–12 families, teachers and support staff, and students in grades 6–12, will be invited to take the annual NYC School Survey starting on **February 12**.

Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer Program (P-EBT)

- The Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer Program (P-EBT) is a federal program to provide food benefits to children who miss the opportunity to receive school meals due to pandemic-related school closures. These benefits take the form of funds on electronic benefit transfer (EBT cards), which can be used in the same manner as SNAP (food stamp) cards. All children who were enrolled in DOE schools during the 2021–22 school year, Summer 2022 or during Summer 2023 school programming are eligible for this benefit.
- At this time, many parents/guardians have not yet utilized these benefits, with millions of dollars currently unspent. These dollars can still be spent on food, and some of these benefits may be expiring soon. To ensure parents are made aware of this benefit, please ensure that your parent coordinators distribute this letter to families, which includes translations. Please note that this is not a DOE program.
